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CANS Command Center Quick-Start Guide

Overview

Using Apex Evaluation's Command Center platform, the Performance Outcomes Reporting Tool (PORT): CANS tool will aid in the digital collection of client data. This step-by-step guide will familiarize users with the new interface.

Section 1: Accessing PORT: CANS in Command Center

1. Open an internet browser (Google Chrome, Microsoft Edge, Firefox).

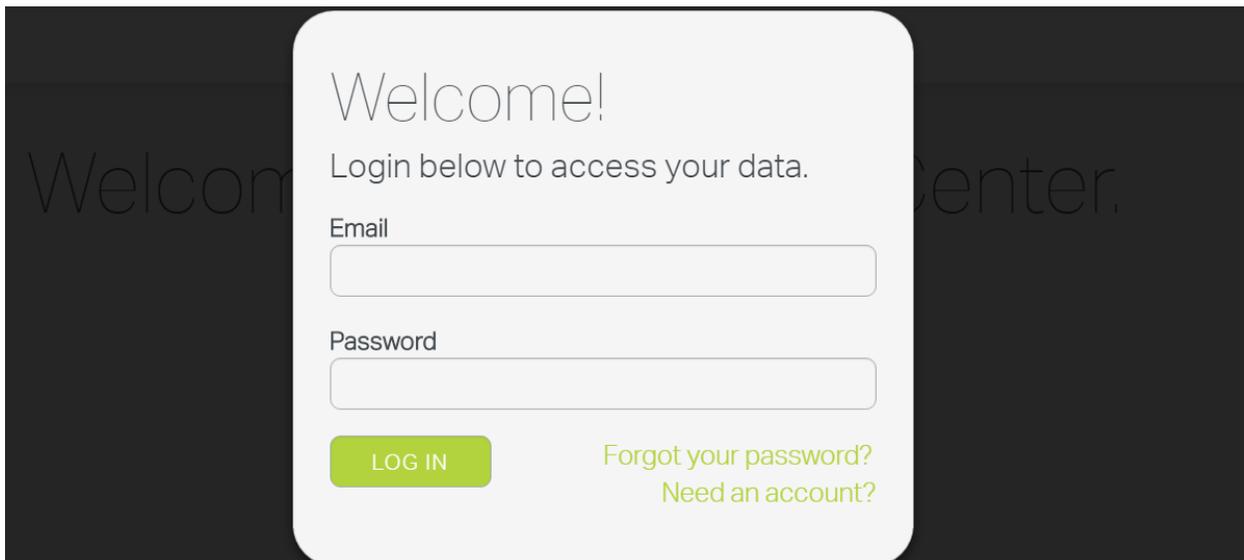


2. In the address bar, input the following link: <https://cc.apexeval.org/>

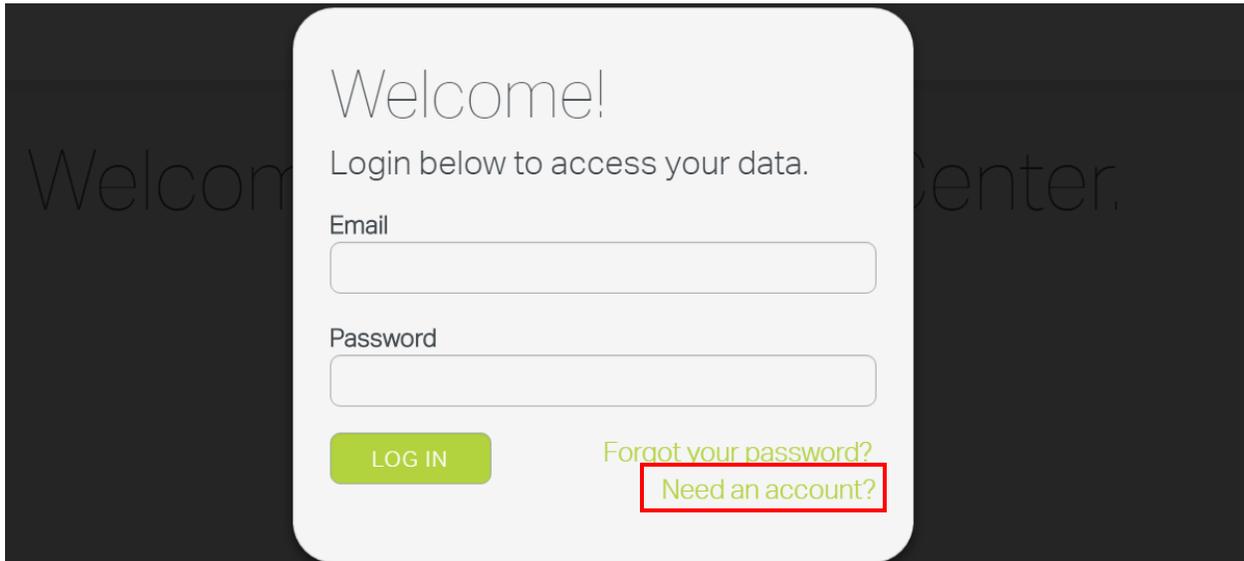


Note - You may want to favorite this link if you will be using it often on the same computer.

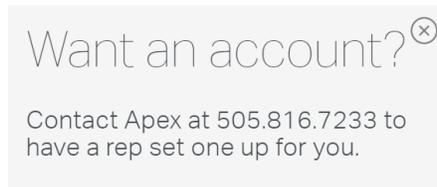
3. <https://cc.apexeval.org/> should direct you to the Apex Command Center login page.



4. If you do not have an account, click the “Need an Account” hyperlink on the homepage.

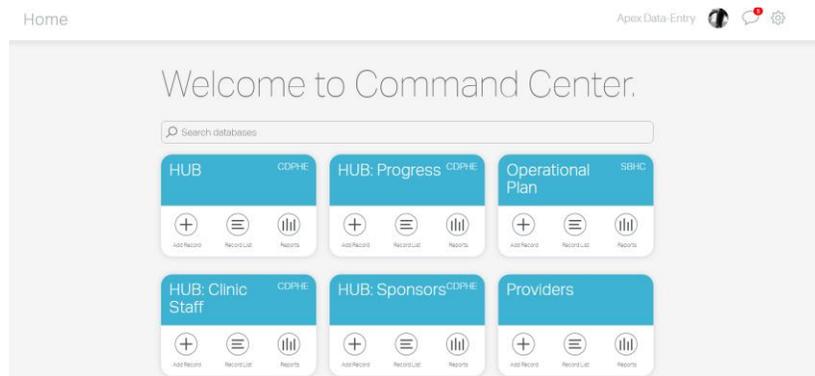


A pop-up window will appear providing contact information for an Apex representative who will assist with your account creation.



5. Once your account has been created, input your login information – the system will then prompt you to create a new login if this is your first-time logging in.

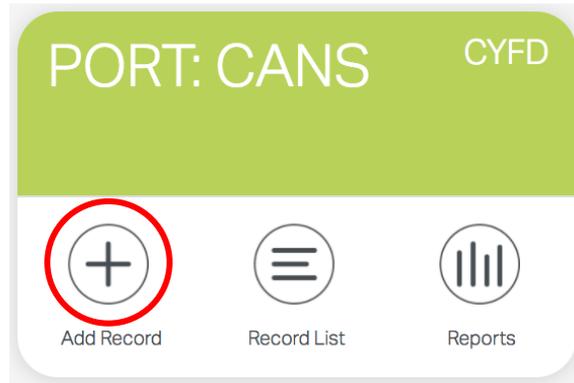
6. Once logged in, you will be taken to the Command Center homepage. This page is populated with data sets tailored specific to your login credentials. (NOTE: the live dataset will be green)



Section 2: Enter new clients from the home page

1. We will be using the PORT: CANS data set

2. To add a new client to the data, select “Add Record”



3. The first screen will be a basic demographics screen, capturing name, DoB, treatment location, gender, race/ethnicity, LGBTQ status, services client is receiving, type of coverage, funding source, and parental status.

4. Select “Save & Continue” to advance to the next screen.



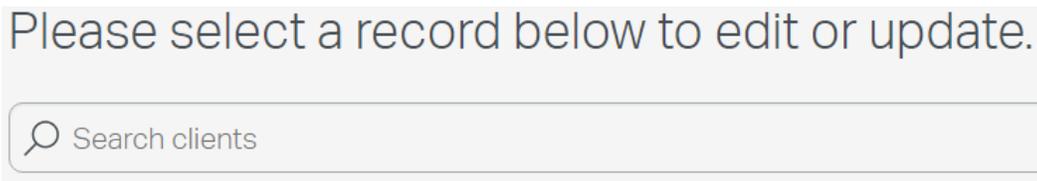
5. This will bring you directly to the client’s CANS survey. You can begin the questionnaire immediately by selecting “Ready! – click to begin”.

You can use the search bar at the top to find your client quickly, searching by name



6. (In the records list) notice each client entry displays information, as well as three hyperlinks.

Here you can select each section to reveal a drop down menu of questions for each section.

- Traumatic / Adverse Childhood Experiences

Exposure to Potentially Traumatic/Adverse Childhood Experiences Domain

These ratings are made based on LIFETIME exposure of trauma or adverse childhood experiences.

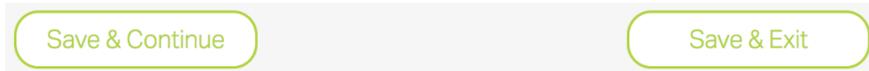
For this domain, the following categories and action levels are used:

- 0 = a dimension where there is no evidence of any trauma of this type.
- 1 = a dimension where a single incident of trauma occurred or suspicion exists of this trauma type.
- 2 = a dimension where the child has experienced multiple incidents or moderate degree of this trauma type.
- 3 = a dimension which describes repeated and severe incidents of trauma with medical /physical consequences.

10. When you are finished with a section, you may select Save & Continue to complete the current section and advance to the next one.

OR

If you need to save current progress and exit Command Center, selection Save & Exit.

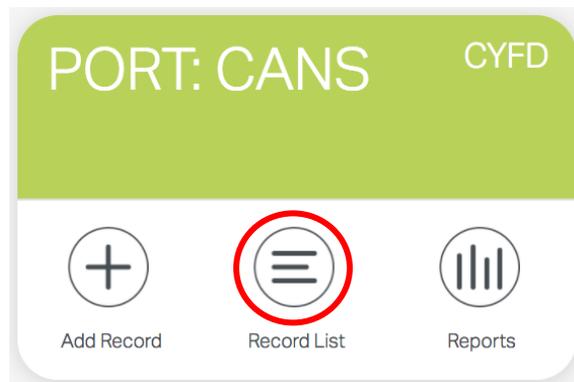


11. As you complete each section, it will be marked with a green checkmark.

Section 3: Updating or Editing an Existing Client

1. Select "Records List" from CANS Chiclet.



2. Find your client in the list of clients, either by using the search bar or scrolling. To continue the CANS survey with a client that is already in progress, select "Update".

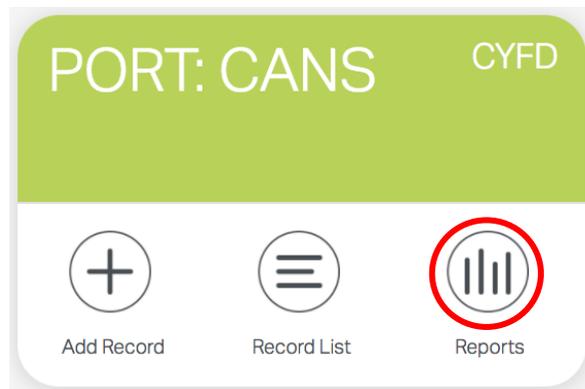

3. Select “Ready! – click to continue”. This will take you to the last saved point in the survey.

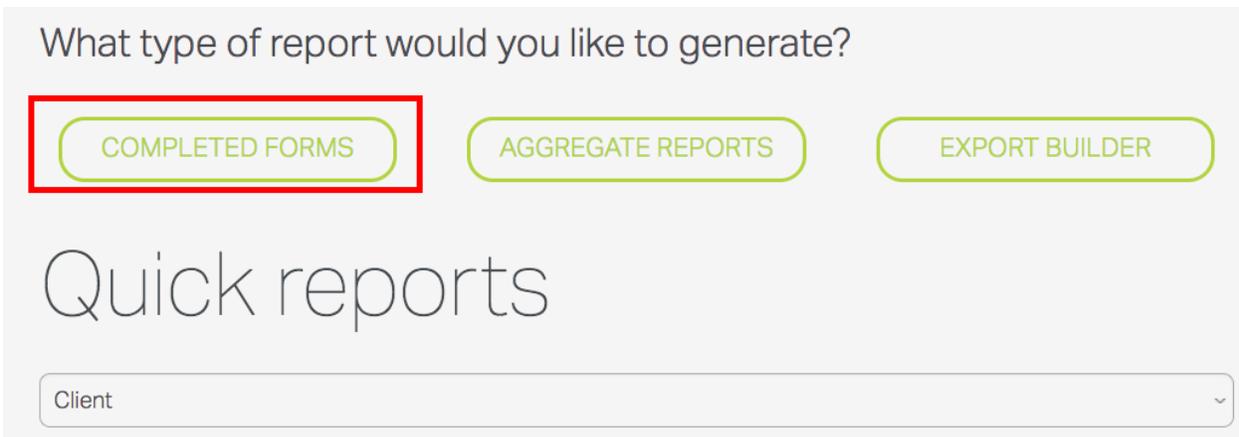

Section 4: Viewing Reports

1. To view data reports, select “Reports” on the CANS Chiclet.

3. Select Completed Forms

From here, multiple client or single client reports can be exported (CSV or PDF).

For a single client report, the user has the option of exporting the CANS report (PDF or HTML), the ACE report (PDF), or the Text report (PDF or HTML).

- Get PDF CANS report – downloads the Bubble report to users computer as a PDF file.
- Get HTML CANS report – opens the Bubble report in a new window in browser.
- Get PDF ACE – downloads the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) Bubble report to users computer as a PDF file.
- Get PDF Text – downloads a summary report of the CANS that includes text answers to users computer as a PDF file.
- Get HTML Text – opens a summary report of the CANS that includes text answers in a new window in browser.

The PDF Bubble option creates a report that displays patient results, strengths, and actions needed, with a scale of responses (0 to 3). Action items are flagged.

The PDF ACE option creates a shorter report that displays patient results on only the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) questions of the CANS. This report also has a scale of responses (0 to 3). A Total ACE Score is provided at the end of the report.

Aggregate Reports section allows the user to view client data in five ways.

- **Individual Progress Report** – This report is available for a client who has a completed baseline and at least one completed follow-up report. This report compares a clients baseline and follow-up scores and provides the user with a view of the clients scores in each domain.

- Individual Progress Report

User should select the preferred domain and client, then select Display Report.

- **Individual vs State Progress Report** – Provides the user with a comparison of a clients baseline scores next to the aggregate state scores in each domain.

- Individual vs State Progress Report

Traumatic/Adverse Childhood Experiences Aaron, Hank - Six Flags - test Display Report

User should select the preferred domain and client, then select Display Report.

- **Item Breakout Report** – The user selects a question and a graph is provided that shows the percent of all participants with an actionable need in 5 areas (Initial, Continuity, Clinical Progress, Newly Identified, and Worsening).



User should select the preferred question, then select Display Report.

- **Aggregate Needs Over Time Report** – Provides the user with a comparison of all clients baseline vs current scores in each domain.



User should select the preferred domain, then select Display Report.

- **Aggregate Strengths Over Time Report** – Provides the user with a comparison of all clients baseline vs current scores in the Child Strengths Domain. This report can provide insight about the development of all participants strengths over time.



User should select the preferred domain, then select Display Report.

5. Export Builder

- 1. SEXUAL ABUSE - This rating describes the child's experience of sexual abuse.
- 2. PHYSICAL ABUSE - This rating describes the child's experience of physical abuse.
- 3. EMOTIONAL ABUSE - This rating describes the degree of severity of emotional abuse, including verbal and nonverbal forms. This item includes both "emotional abuse," which would include psychological maltreatment such as insults or humiliation towards a child and/or "emotional neglect" defined as the denial of emotional attention and/or support from caregivers.

Once the user has checked or unchecked all relevant fields, scroll to the bottom of the page and select Get CSV file.

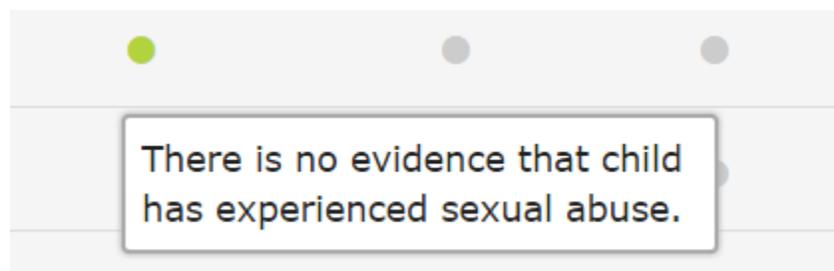
