



Health Professionals Need Just Health

Health professionals need timely, detailed, and accurate data to better serve their adolescent and young adult populations. But asking sensitive questions can be awkward, particularly when it comes to mental health, alcohol, drugs, and sex. The need for Just Health is clear:

- **Adolescents** are underserved in the healthcare system. Vulnerable populations - including the high percentage of youth living in poverty, racial and ethnic minorities, and LGBT youth - are even more at risk. School-linked care is a vital access point for adolescents.
- **Sexual Health.** Of the 20 million Americans diagnosed with an STD each year, over 50% are adolescents aged 13-24, which account for 17% of the sexually active population. Most didn't know they had an STD. CDC experts estimate there are 2-3 times as many STDs that remain undetected.
- **Mental Health.** Of the 50% of the population identified as having a mental health issue, most go untreated.
- **Trauma.** The more types of childhood adversity experienced, the higher the risk of chronic disease, mental illness, and violence. Most people (64%) have at least one adverse childhood experience.
- **Alcohol and Drugs.** Almost 90% of those with addictions do not seek treatment.
- **Intersectionality.** Mental health, trauma, substance use, and sexual behavior coincide in different ways to create risks that require customized responses.


Health experts say collecting accurate information about patient behavior is the hardest part of their job.
